- The questions are designed to guide the reader through the entire novel.
- Submit your completed project to your English III teacher by *Tuesday, August 30*, 2022. (This project will be a major grade.) See Rubric. The assignment MUST be submitted via Google Classroom.

Reading - The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks by Rebecca Skloot

Writing - Students will be required to respond to THREE writing prompts with analysis and textual evidence to support their claims/assertion.

Criteria for success:

- MLA formatting (visit the website below for more information: https://owl.purdue.edu/owl/research_and_citation/mla_style/mla_formatting and style guide/mla formatting and style guide.html)
- Appropriate and relevant textual citations and references. (follow MLA format)
- Minimum 150 words for **each** response question;
- INCLUDE a minimum of one CITED QUOTATION and one illustrated example for each of the three response questions.
- MUST be typed and submitted electronically. (The assignment MUST be submitted via Google Classroom.)
- Less than 10% summary stick to analysis

RESPONSE Questions: The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks by Rebecca Skloot

- 1. How does Henrietta Lack's story change your way of thinking about ethics and privacy? Be specific with evidence from the text in your response.
- 2. Your junior (11th grade) year focuses on a theme of identity- (Who am I? What is my role in society?). Using Henrietta Lack's story, what issues directly connect to our community/ and or the world? Explain using evidence from the text.
- 3. In reflection of your response for #2, what is your role in making a change in the community you serve or the world you seek? What are some solutions to the problems you see, and how would you go about making a change? Be specific with evidence from the text.
